Michael Andrews Bespoke

Newbies to the custom-suit game will feel right at home in Michael Andrews Bespoke's new nonstuffy location, tucked away on an alley off Great Jones Street. The tri-level space is outfitted with comfy pin-striped seating, perfect for kicking back with a complimentary drink from the 12-foot oak bar after you've been measured for a bespoke suit (\$895–\$5,995). Pair your new ensemble with items from the house-line of accessories, such as grenade cufflinks (\$29) and **MAB's signature pocket squares (\$29)**. On the third floor, Italian shoe brand Scarpe di Bianco will run a showroom for its custom leather shoes (\$1,035)—making one-stop shopping all the easier. Modern:Anthology

Proving manly apartments need not be synonymous with bare walls, owners John Marsala and Becka Citron have filled this rustic shop with rugged furniture and home decor. The duo has designed rooms for Snoop Dogg, Raimn Wilson and Guy Fieri; their keen eye comes in handy when sourcing vintage pieces—like an oversize brown leather Chesterfield sofa (\$3,200)—from local estate sales, antique markets and trade shows. While the shop has no shortage of indulgent splurges—including pillows crafted from vintage British bus-route signs (\$165–\$210) and plaid bedding that looks and feels like men's shirting (\$295–\$445)—you'll also find an array of glassware, reclaimed wood mirrors and vintage army blankets for less than \$200. Stark Waxing Studio at Sally Hershberger Face Place

This West Coast salon earned a devoted following by tending to the bikini lines and brows of West Hollywood. Now Stark's brand of waxing is bicoastal, and the speedy staff is ready to strip your arms (\$30–50), legs (\$40–\$75) and

unmentionables (full Brazilian \$70–\$85) hairless. Germaphobes will be happy to hear that the studio, which occupies a few private rooms within Sally Hershberger Face Place, enforces a strict no-double-dipping policy—each stick gets one dunk in the hard French blue wax before it's traded for a new one. To minimize the chance of ingrown hairs, pick up Stark's citrusy body scrub (\$24), or treat yourself to the brand's hand-poured candles (\$28) to calm your frazzled nerves. *425 W 14th St at Washington St (212-367-8200, starkwaxingstudio.com). Suite New York

This swanky showroom is bidding its Upper East Side outpost farewell and headed to a new Flatiron locale. Owners Kris Fuchs and Maria Sepulveda often jet to Europe to source Suite's to-die-for home decor. Though pricey, standout pieces like chain-link mother-of-pearl Fun Lamps (\$900) and **origami-esque GJ Chairs (\$2,500)** are investments that will stay with you long after your Ikea couch has found its new home via Craigslist. *419 Park Ave South at 29th St (212-421-3300, suiteny.com). Vintage Modern

Owner Erin Hall has filled this tin-ceilinged space with the midcentury American furniture she previously sold at the Artists & Fleas market. In addition to pieces like a George Nelson for Herman Miller bleached mahogany bookshelf (\$975), you'll find plenty of affordable housewares, including a set of nautical-themed melamine plates and saucers (\$40) and garbage cans printed with world maps (\$30). *110 Meserole Ave between Leonard St and Manhattan Ave, Greenpoint, Brooklyn (347-560-9605, vintagemodernnyc.com).
